

COLORADO CHAPTER OF NHF ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 2022 A Scholarship for Continuing Education



Each year NHF Colorado proudly awards two scholarships annually to those in the bleeding disorder community to help further secondary education. The Colorado Chapter Scholarship is provided by the Colorado Chapter of the National Hemophilia Foundation and is funded through chapter fundraisers. The Jana Marie Lambert Memorial Scholarship is presented by the Lambert family in honor of Jana's service to the hemophilia community.

The two scholarships are available to any Colorado resident who has a bleeding disorder, is an immediate family member of someone with a bleeding disorder, or an immediate family member of someone who has died due to complications of a bleeding disorder. The applicant must be in the process of seeking a post-secondary education, which can include a college or university, or a trade school.

The Colorado Chapter Scholarship awards at minimum a \$1,000 award and The Jana Marie Lambert Memorial award of \$1,500. You will be considered for **both** awards per one application.

An applicant is eligible to receive the grant multiple times, however, preference will be given to those who have not received funding prior. NHF Colorado will take several factors into consideration when determining the award recipients:

- Chapter involvement
- Volunteer experience
- Vision and future goals
- Essay narrative
- Academic merit

The Academic Scholarship Application must be received at the NHF Colorado office by **May 1, 2022**. Selected recipients will be contacted after June 30, 2022. Applications can be emailed to info@cohemo.org or mailed to NHF Colorado at the following address:

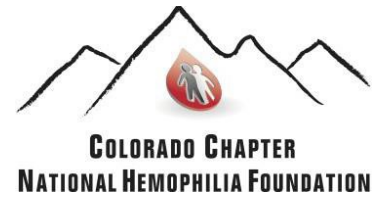

Letters of Recommendation

Please include at least two letters of support. These letters must be included for your application to be complete and must be in a Sealed Envelope, emailed from the recommender directly to info@cohemo.org, or they can follow the “Academic Scholarship Letter of Recommendation Form” link on the scholarship page. Submitting more than two letters will not affect your chances of being selected. Deadline for receiving this information is May 1, 2022.

One letter must be from a teacher, instructor or professor who taught you in a class and should address your potential to achieve your academic goals.

One letter can be from an employer, church leader, health care provider or other professional person who is involved in your life.

In writing this letter of reference have them include comments reflecting your knowledge and insight pertaining to the following areas: the individual's educational and career goals, how this individual's bleeding disorder and/family member's bleeding disorder has affected their educational and career goals, how you see this individual utilizing the scholarship, and any other information that you feel would be important for the committee reviewers to know.

Transcripts

Please mail an official or unofficial transcript (“issued to student” transcripts are not acceptable) from the school in which you are currently enrolled sent to NHF Colorado. *This transcript must be sent by postal mail to NHF Colorado, uploaded on the digital application, or emailed to info@cohemo.org.* If you are currently enrolled in school, please have your most recent transcript sent. High school seniors entering college should send their high school transcript.

Declaration of Applicant

If there is a change in any of the information presented in the application, I will promptly notify the Colorado Chapter of the National Hemophilia Foundation.
