

Assistance Programs available to Bleeding Disorder Patients

This is an overview of financial assistance programs available to the bleeding disorders community. Please note that many assistance programs ask that your bleeding disorder or acute bleeds have impacted your ability to work (resulting in loss of wages, for example) in order to be eligible for financial assistance. NHF CO can assist with travel & lodging costs if you are traveling to the HTC from a distance away.
