A Note from Your Executive Director

Colorado continues to make great progress in the fight against COVID-19. As of this writing, nearly 2 Million Coloradans have been fully vaccinated, and more than 500,000 have confirmed positive since the pandemic began, offering hope that we can begin returning to more familiar activities later this summer. You may have seen in the news recently the state's decision to bring the MLB All Star game to Denver as a high-profile indication that gathering in large groups is something that will resume soon.

Our Chapter is eager to bring the community together in a safe and socially responsible way. After much analysis, we have concluded that it will not be possible to implement Mile High Summer Camp in a manner that can ensure health protections for all participants at the strictest levels that are essential. This is consistent with decisions of bleeding disorders organizations across the country and other chronic condition groups in our state. The close proximity of campers, interactive activity, multiple day/night stays, and challenges in providing a full medical team are unique variables that prevent us from moving forward. However, we are diligently exploring offering a one-night Family Camp June 12-13 and possibly again in late August, as well as a potential overnight teen experience in mid-July. This requires a great deal work to coordinate logistics and develop safety protocols, so look for an official announcement later this month. And join us on Wednesday, May 12 for a Community Town Hall with the HTC where we will discuss the state of operations as well as COVID-related information.

We have so valued your engagement with our virtual activities and your determination to overcome the pandemic. We will be able to celebrate these efforts together in person soon!

State Advocacy Day hosted on Thursday, April 22nd

In the Colorado Legislature, Representative Mullica announced March as Bleeding Disorders Awareness Month in a tribute to the house floor. During the month of March teen advocates from across 3 different states gathered virtually to learn how they can use their voice to advocate everyday in a great display of interstate collaboration. During April we celebrated World Hemophilia Day as Senator Ginal spoke on behalf of the bleeding disorder community, announcing the tribute to the senate floor while inviting the legislators to join us for State Advocacy Day. It was amazing to have the dedicated time for constituents to speak directly with elected s to raise awareness for bleeding disorders and express our healthcare concerns.

CALL TO ACTION

NHF Colorado alongside other concerned patient disease groups like the Chronic Care Collaborative have been closely monitoring <u>House Bill 21-1297 Pharmacy Benefit Manager And Insurer Requirements.</u> This bill will ensure Colorado pharmacies and their patients are treated fairly and equitably; patient access to pharmacy services is preserved; patients have access to affordable, life-saving medications; and transactions between PBMs, patients, and pharmacies are transparent. This bill also includes important non-medical switching and patient protections.

If you or someone you know has had trouble with mid-year formulary changes or problems with mail order prescriptions, your voice could make a vital impact in the passing of this bill. We would greatly appreciate your help raising awareness by sharing your story either through virtual oral or written testimonies. We can assist with helping to craft personal stories.
